

Phillipsburg Union Station



Phillipsburg Union Station was constructed in 1913 as a commuter rail station. After many years of disrepair De Sapia Construction was contracted to begin Phase I of the building restoration. This included repairing the original wood window sash and restoring the original entry doors. Missing windows were replaced with new windows that were carefully fabricated to match those on the original drawings. Cast stone sills and brickwork that were damaged and missing were also replaced; seamlessly matching the existing. Using pieces of the original woodwork, the missing and broken woodwork were fabricated in our shop to precisely match the existing. The site is currently in the process of being listed on the National Registry of Historical Places.
